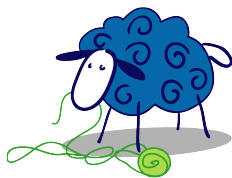


# Miniature Raglan Sweater

# Knitting Matters™

These little raglans are knitted from the top down on double-pointed needles. They make adorable ornaments or gift tie-ons. Imagine knitting a sweater as a gift for someone and then using your leftover yarn to make a matching mini sweater to tie on the outside of the package...always a big hit at baby showers!



## PATTERN SPECIFICATIONS

**Sizes:** Sweater size depends on yarn and needles used. Sock yarn makes a sweater that is about 2 inches high; worsted weight will make a 3" high version.

**Gauge:** Irrelevant for this project. No swatching required!

**Yarn:** Small amount of any weight yarn, from fingering up to worsted (one 50g ball can make several of these little sweaters).

**Needles:** Set of 5 double-pointed needles in appropriate size for your yarn.

**Notions needed:** 4 stitch markers, stitch holder, scissors, tapestry needle.

### Key to Abbreviations

**Inc 1** - increase by knitting in front and back of next stitch  
**K** - knit  
**K2tog** - knit 2 sts together  
**P** - purl  
**PM** - place marker  
**RS** - right side  
**SM** - slip marker  
**St(s)** - stitch(es)  
**WS** - wrong side
