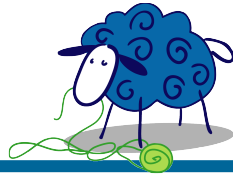


Picot Wristers

Knitting Matters™

These feminine wristers have a simple cable on the back of the hand and a picot edging at the top. They're knitted in the round so there are no side seams to sew.



The version on the left was knitted with Heritage Handpaint in the 'Trout' colorway. The one below was done in Socks That Rock (lightweight) in the 'Fred Flintstone' colorway. (360 yds/4.5 oz hank).



PATTERN SPECIFICATIONS

Sizes: Woman's Small (Medium, Large): 6.75" (7.25", 8") circumference. Measure around your palm, excluding the thumb, and choose the size that's slightly smaller than your hand so the cable will be opened up when the hand is inserted.

Gauge: 32 sts and 44 rows per 4" (10 cm) in stockinette stitch. Do a swatch!

Yarn: 125 (150, 175) yds of a sock weight yarn.

Needles: Set of 5 size 1 US (2.25mm) double points (or appropriate size to get gauge with your yarn).

Notions: cable needle, 3 stitch markers, scissors, tapestry needle, 6" piece of contrast color waste yarn to hold gusset sts.

<FlexTip #1>

Some other yarns that would work just as well are Brown Sheep Nature Spun Fingering, Dale Baby Ull, Plymouth Sockotta Sock, any self-patterning sock yarn or a handpainted one like Koigu.

<FlexTip #2>

Don't like the picot trim? Finish with a half inch of K2, P2 ribbing instead.

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
