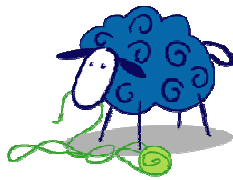


# Waves of Color - Kids' Collection

A curly wave motif serves as the transition from one color to the next around the yoke on this colorful pullover. First knit the body in the round, knit the two sleeves as smaller tubes, join them all together, work only six rounds of two colors at a time, then quickly finish up to the neck. Besides being a fun project, this is a great introduction to stranded colorwork for those who are new to this versatile technique.



This sample was made with Cascade 220 in colors 7802 (MC) and 8834 (CC). (100% wool) (3.5 oz/100 g, 220 yds/200 m) You can also use Cascade 220 Superwash if you prefer. Model shown in size 26.5".

## PATTERN SPECIFICATIONS

**Finished Chest Sizes:** 26.5 (29, 30, 32.5, 33.75)"/67 (74, 76, 83, 86) cm. Choose the size that is 2-3 inches larger than the actual chest measurement of the intended wearer. Approx child sizes: 6 (8, 10, 12, 14)

**Gauge:** 20 sts and 28 rows per 4" (10 cm) in stockinette stitch. Do a swatch to get your gauge right!

**Needles:** Size 7US (4.5mm) double points and 16" and 24" circulars (and 32" optional) (or size you need to get gauge).

**Yarn:** Main Color: 380 (445, 530, 640, 720) yds.; Contrast Color: 150 (200, 220, 250, 290) yds.

**Notions:** stitch markers, stitch holders or waste yarn, and tapestry needle.
